

Once again, thank you for standing with us in our mission to create a brighter future for natural diamond communities. We are grateful for the trust you have placed in Diamonds Do Good.



GLOBAL IMPACT



At Diamonds Do Good, our goal is to create life-changing impact in the journey of natural diamonds from the moment they are mined, cut, and polished to the time they are cherished forever and to communicate this impact to consumers.

We currently support active programs in the **Northwest Territories of Canada**, the third largest producer of natural diamonds, **India**, where nine out of 10 natural diamonds are cut and polished, and **diamond-producing countries in Africa,** with special emphasis on **Botswana**, the leading producer of gem quality natural diamonds.

Because of your support in 2023, we were able to expand a critical community-advancing program into India and the Northwest Territories of Canada.

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

In 2023, Diamonds Do Good gave **over \$400,000** in grants to programs making life-changing impact in natural diamond communities.

Diamonds Do Good prioritizes the United Nation's **Sustainable Development Goals**, specifically Goal 4 (**Quality Education**), 5 (**Gender Equality**), 8 (**Decent Work & Economic Growth**), 10 (**Reduced Inequalities**), & 17 (**Partnerships for the Goals**).

DIAMONDS DO GOOD ENTREPRENEURSHIP GRANTS

- Africa, India, NWT

Entrepreneurship promotes economic growth, provides access to goods and services, and improves the overall standard of living. Entrepreneurs make a positive impact on their communities and improve their well-being by catering to underserved areas and developing environment-friendly products.

In 2021, Diamonds Do Good launched the DDG Entrepreneurship Grant Program to support entrepreneurs in natural diamond communities who are making an impact.

Since the inception of this program, Diamonds Do Good has supported 725 entrepreneurs in diamond communities through a 16-week entrepreneurship program guided by leading business moguls and professors from around the world.

Diamonds Do Good has supported 30 entrepreneurs with grants ranging from 5,000-20,000 USD to support their businesses and advance their communities.

Diamonds Do Good expanded this program in 2023 to include entrepreneurs in India. In 2024, we will expand this program to include the Northwest Ferritories of Canada.

MINE TRAINING SOCIETY -Northwest Territories of Canada

In the rural Northwest Territories of Canada, the diamond industry is one of the main economic driversas thousands of people are employed at mines and many social-economic benefits have arisen due to this industry.

For most local youth, continued education is a barrier to furthering the community through needed career-fields like physicians, pharmacists, or engineers.

Diamonds Do Good created a partnership with the Mine Training Society to help bridge the barrier to continued education by granting students in need with scholarships to provide the neccessary resources to start or finish school.

Since the partnership began in 2018, Diamonds Do Good has granted over \$150,000 to support this program.

SENTEBALE - Botswana

In Sub-Saharan Africa, around 4,200 adolescent girls and young women ages 15-24 are diagnosed with HIV... every week.

Since 2018, Diamonds Do Good has partnered with leading NGO Sentebale in Botswana to provide mental health resources and programming for youth impacted by HIV/AIDS.

Diamonds Do Good specifically funds the Let Youth Lead and Radio Positive Programming.

Let Youth Lead empowers young adults to become advocates and mentors for their younger peers who have recently been diagnosed with HIV. These advocates are providing mental health services, peer-to-peer counseling and reducing the stigma of living with HIV.

Radio Positive is a radio program fully sponsored by Diamonds Do Good that reached 85% of the Botswana population.

FLAVIANA MATATA FOUNDATION - Tanzania

In Tanzania, many girls and young women drop out of school due to various reasons including teenage pregnancies, child marriage, and poverty.

Diamonds Do Good has partnered with the Flaviana Matata Foundation to empower the girls and young women these areas to become educated, self-sufficient leaders in their communities.

In 2023, Diamonds Do Good has supported 5,500 girls and young women through programs put on by FMF including Scholarship Programs, Back to School Funding, Menstrual Cycle Management, and the building of schools, classrooms, and washrooms for students and teachers.

The Diamonds Do Good Bracelet has been successful throughout 2023 for its efforts in raising funds for the Flaviana Matata Foundation and empowering retailers to tell the powerful stories of natural diamonds.

DDG is one of the biggest examples [of nonprofits making an impact]. We have girls who are graduating from college, getting jobs, going back to their communities, and supporting their families.

RENAISSANCE SCHOOL -

South Africa

In Limpopo, South Africa, right outside of De Beers Venetia Mine, the Renaissance Secondary School is the school of over 1,500 students.

During a 2019 visit to the school, the International Group the Young Diamantaires established a need for the school to have a science lab to further the students education and allow them to have a competitive edge in the job market.

Since 2020, Diamonds Do Good has partnered with the Young Diamantaires raising funds for the completion of the science lab.

During a 2023 visit to the school, DDG Board Member Kealeboga Pule and staff discovered the school lacked electricity.

In an ongoing effort for 2023, Diamonds Do Good is working with De Beers and the Young Diamantaires to ensure the school is a safe and reliable place for students to learn.

Growing up in a school very similar to this, I understand the impact of the teachers, the classroom, and the buildings. Diamonds Do Good and the natural diamond industry continue to make a powerful impact on students in South Africa and beyond."

VEERAYATAN - India

In rural communities outside of Gujarat, India, many young people are faced with challenges such as a high population density, low literacy rate, and inadequate infrastructure.

Since 2015, Diamonds Do Good has supported leading NGO Veerayatan with specific scholarships aimed to help students and young people with needed funding in the STEM sciences.

The goal of The Diamonds Do Good Scholarships with Veerayatan is to assist youth by giving scholarships to 18-30 years of age, who are seeking additional training and/or education that is needed in their community.

Since the inception of this program in 2015, Diamonds Do Good has given over \$500,000 to support students in India and empower them to further their education and pursue their dreams.

MEET A DIAMONDS DO GOOD GRANT RECIPIENT

One of 30 entrepreneurs awarded a DDG Entrepreneurship grant, Tshireletso is a farmer in a small village in Botswana.

When Tshireletso started the free entrepreneurship program made available to her by Diamonds Do Good, she had no expectations of recieving funding for her farm.

Tshireletso persevered through 16-weeks of intensive business classes and many rounds of interviews and business pitches.

In 2022, Tshireletso received a grant from Diamonds Do Good.

At the time, her business, Erba Farms, started out in the window sill of her parent's backyard. Now, the business, which is currently in over 25 supermarkets across Botswana, employs eight people in her rural community - creating lasting, positive impact and changing the lives of her employees and their families.

women in Tanzania.

The bracelet launched with our key partner retailers including Jared, Hamilton Jewelers, Greenwich St. Jewelers, Royal Asscher, and Onirikka Fine Jewelry.
